## Abstract

India's public health and nutrition landscape is undergoing a significant transformation, influenced by demographic shifts, epidemiological transitions, and changing social and economic determinants. The dual burden of undernutrition and overnutrition, coupled with a surge in nutrition-related chronic diseases, poses complex challenges for achieving equitable health outcomes. In this dynamic context, the 13th Annual Conference of the Indian Health Economics and Policy Association (IHEPA), in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Mandi, seeks to provide a platform for interdisciplinary dialogue on this issue. The conference aims to explore the interconnections between health, nutrition, and wellbeing through rigorous evidence-based research and critical policy evaluation. By bringing together researchers, policymakers, and practitioners, the conference aspires to generate actionable insights that address existing disparities and support inclusive, sustainable development. Contributions that examine the social, economic, and behavioural dimensions of nutrition and health systems will be particularly encouraged.

## Pre-Conference Workshop

### Workshop-1: Spatial Analysis in Health using R

**Resource person:** Dr. Pankaj Narula (Thapar University, Patiala, Punjab)

Spatial analysis reveals geographic patterns in healthcare access, disease burden, and resource gaps. This workshop equips researchers with R programming to analyse spatial health data (e.g., NFHS/LASI). Participants will learn to visualise disparities, process geospatial data, and generate evidence for equitable policy decisions in the Indian context.

### Workshop-2: Health Econometrics and Machine Learning (ML) using Python

**Resource person:** Dr. Subrata Mukherjee (University of Mumbai, Mumbai)

This workshop bridges traditional health econometrics with cutting-edge machine learning using Python. Participants will learn to analyse health datasets through both econometric modelling (linear/logistic regression) and ML techniques (Random Forests, LASSO), while gaining skills in text analysis of health documents. Designed for health economists and policy researchers, the curriculum covers the full analytical pipeline from data preprocessing to advanced modelling using Python's scientific stack.

## Awards and Certificates

### T. N. Krishnan Award

The best paper award for early-career researchers (below 40 years) will be given in honour of Prof. T.N. Krishnan. A certificate and an honorarium of ₹ 20,000/- for the best paper selected by the conference committee will be provided to the first author.

### Gavin Mooney Prize

The two best papers by Ph.D. students will be awarded in honour of Prof. Gavin Mooney. An honorarium of ₹ 10,000/- each will be provided for the best papers by PhD scholars as selected by the conference committee. The PhD students should be the presenters and the lead authors of the research paper.

### Mayanka Ambade Early Career Research Award

The best paper by an early-career researcher (below 35 years) will be awarded in honour of Dr. Mayanka Ambade. An honorarium of ₹ 10,000/- will be provided for the best paper by an early-career researcher as selected by the conference committee. The early career researcher should be the presenter and the lead author of the research paper.

*All the paper presenters and participants will receive certificates for their participation.*

Please submit the abstract in the following prescribed format:

- Authors are requested to submit extended abstracts within a word limit of 900-1000 (excluding references) in electronic form via <https://forms.gle/7ThN2o7qUd742viW7> on or before 25th September 2025, 11:59 PM IST.
- The organising committee will review all abstracts, and based on this review, some selected abstracts will be invited to submit a full paper for oral presentation.
- All the paper presenters and attendees will receive certificates for their respective participation.
- Researchers who want their papers to be considered for any of the mentioned awards must send the complete paper before the given deadline.

- Title of the Abstract: Times New Roman, Font Size- 14 pts, bold.
- Author(s): Full name in Times New Roman, font size- 12 pts, bold and italics.
- Author(s) Affiliation: Name of the institute, designation and contact details in Times New Roman, font size- 12 pts.
